Renowned for performing on twin grand pianos, their four-hands piano talent, virtuosity and genius is dedicated to classic jazz, arrangements of songs from the swing era and draws from the ragtime and blues repertoire.

Tickets are \$75 per person and includes a happy hour reception with a sumptuous cocktail buffet, wine, beer and soft drinks. A silent auction featuring signed books and photos will also be showcased. The reception will take place from 5 to 6:30 pm with the concert following at 7 pm.
