**CHRIS MATTHEWS, “HARDBALL” HOST TO SPEAK IN PHOENIX MARCH 21**

***“Tip and The Gipper: When Politics Worked” Author Presented by Sandra Day O’Connor Institute***

March 17, 2016 (Phoenix, AZ) – Chris Matthews, host of MSNBC’s *“Hardball”* will be in Phoenix, Monday, March 21<sup>st</sup> on the eve of the Arizona Presidential Primary Election. Together, the two men became one of history’s most celebrated political pairings—the epitome of how ideological opposites can get things done.
