

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 3

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF ARIZONA RELATING TO THE LEGISLATURE; PRESCRIBING PROCEDURE FOR READING OF BILLS, AND AMENDING ARTICLES 4, PART 2, SECTION 12, CONSTITUTION OF ARIZONA.

Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Arizona, the House of Representatives concurring:

1. The following amendment of article 4, part 2, section 12, Constitution of Arizona, is proposed, to become valid when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and upon proclamation of the governor:

12. PROCEDURE ON BILLS; APPROVAL OR DISAPPROVAL BY GOVERNOR

Section 12. Every bill shall be read by sections on three different days, unless in case of emergency, two-thirds of either House deem it expedient to dispense with this rule. ~~; but the reading of a bill by sections on its final passage shall in no case be dispensed with, and~~ The vote on the final passage of any bill or joint resolution shall be taken by ayes and nays on roll call. Every measure when finally

passed shall be presented to the Governor for his approval or disapproval.

2. The proposed amendment (approved by a majority of the members elected to each house of the legislature, and entered upon the respective journals thereof, together with the ayes and nays thereon) shall be by the secretary of state submitted to the qualified electors at the next regular general election (or at a special election called for that purpose), as provided by article 21, Constitution of Arizona.

Passed the House April 22, 1971 by the following vote: 31 Ayes,
23 Nays, 6 Not Voting.

Passed the Senate March 5, 1971 by the following vote: 19 Ayes,
10 Nays, 1 Not Voting.
