RELATING TO CRIMES; PRESCRIBING DEFINITIONS OF THEFT, GRAND THEFT AND PETTY
THEFT, AND AMENDING SECTIONS 13-661 AND 13-663, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

Section 1. Section 13-661, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

13-661. <u>Definition; methods; continuing nature of</u>
false representation

A. Theft is:

- 1. Feloniously stealing, taking, carrying, leading or driving away the personal property of another.
- 2. Finding lost property under circumstances which give the finder knowledge of or means of inquiry as to the true owner, and appropriation of such property to the finder's own use or to the use of another person not entitled thereto, without first making reasonable and just efforts to find the true owner and restore the property to him.
- 3. Knowingly and designingly, by any false or fraudulent representation or pretense, defrauding any other person of money, labor, or property. OR ANYTHING WITH DETERMINABLE VALUE whether real or personal.
- 4. Causing or procuring another to report falsely of his wealth or mercantile character and thus obtaining credit, and thereby fraudulently obtaining possession of money, property or the labor or service of another.

B. Any false and fraudulent representation or pretense shall be treated as continuing so as to include any money, property or service received as a result thereof, and the complaint, information or indictment may charge that the crime was committed on any date during the period in question.

Sec. 2. Section 13-663, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

13-663. Degrees of theft

A. "Grand theft" is:

- 1. Theft of money, labor, or property OR ANYTHING WITH DETERMINABLE VALUE of the value of more than one hundred dollars.
 - 2. Theft of money or property from the person of another.
- 3. Theft of a horse, mare, gelding, colt, cow, steer, bull, calf, mule, jack, jenny, goat, sheep, hog, or any neat or horned animal.
- B. "Petty theft" is theft of any money, labor, or property OR ANYTHING WITH DETERMINABLE VALUE, not included in grand theft.
